As we finally arrive on the other side of this most contentious election, we find that things are, in many ways, much as before. Our nation is still divided. We still don't trust one another or our institutions. One side refuses to even concede that the election is lost. More importantly, the pandemic continues to rage, people continue to suffer from loss of jobs and incomes, needs continue to abound.

It's tempting in these moments to say that Fernwood should be the kind of place where Democrats and Republicans can put aside their differences and worship together. It is that kind of place, to be sure. We have people who vote differently and still love one another and sit beside one another in the pew (or at least we sat beside one another during pre-COVID days).

But I don't think the purpose of the church is to simply act like our differences don't matter. They do matter. How we vote, which is really a reflection of how we see the world and act in it, matters. But voting is just something we do one day a year, or every two years, or even four years. (If you are only voting every four years, you should vote in off year elections).

What I'm calling us all to is an ethic that transcends our worldly labels to an ethic based in Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. And that should make all of us uncomfortable because none of us are living up to that standing. But we try. And we need to live into that calling every day, in every situation. We take that identity and ethic into the voting booth and vote for the person who best represents it, knowing that no candidate will live up to it, either. And then we get up the next day and carry on with our work of loving people with the fierce and jealous love of God. We continue to call others to a vision of a possible world beyond election cycles and vote counts. We call them to the values of God's Reign here on earth: where all have enough, where all tears are wiped away, where none are forgotten or left without.

I was mesmerized by this video that features over 300 churches and religious organizations on the island of Ireland that combined their efforts into a rendering of the Irish hymn, Be Thou My Vision. This hymn, sometimes called the Prayer of St. Patrick, is over 1000 years old, yet is remains as relevant as ever in today's world. The video ends with the Irish Blessing.

The texts are below:

Be Thou my vision, O Lord of my heart; Naught be all else to me, save that Thou art; Thou my best thought, in the day and the night; Waking or sleeping, Thy presence my light.
