Choral Corner

If I were to survey our congregation to find the top 15 or 20 most beloved hymns, there would be many that would appear on everyone's list. One that would likely be name by most of us is the hymn Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee. The text was written in 1907 by Henry van Dyke, and it is the only hymn by this lessor known writer in our hymnal. The tune, however, is the element of the hymn that we most quickly recognize, and it was written by a much more famous individual...Ludwig van Beethoven.

His tune Ode to Joy is used with five different hymns in our hymnal. We last sang the familiar text of van Dyke's back in May. We will sing the tune again at the end of August with the hymn Alleluia, Sing to Jesus.

This very famous melody was first heard nearly 200 years ago in Vienna, Austria at the premiere of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony. This symphony was ground-breaking in many ways. In addition to being one of the longest symphonies yet written (about an hour and 15 minutes), it was the first time a composer had introduced voices into the genre. Beethoven scored the fourth movement for four vocal soloists as well as a large chorus, and the Ode to Joy tune is the backbone of the movement. Perhaps the most remarkable thing about this work is that Beethoven never heard it performed, even though he was actually on the stage during its premiere on May 7, 1824. For by this point in his life, he had become completely deaf. In fact, most of the greatest works from the latter part of this most influential composer's life were written without the aid of hearing.

It was a real challenge to choose just one performance of the final movement of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony to pass on to you, but the one I landed on is one of the best. This performance is from the BBC Proms Music Festival with Daniel Barenboim conducting, and it was recorded nine years ago this week.
